JBWS strives to provide safety, support and solutions for abuse. Our strengths-based, client-focused, and trauma-informed approaches are at the core of our direct service programs. Our educational outreach programs are at the heart of our over-arching mission – the prevention of domestic violence.

**5,039** Helpline callers received confidential crisis assistance, support, information and referrals

**5,551** Hours of community-based group counseling provided support to **221** adult survivors

**4,547** Hours of children's counseling, structured recreation, and camp experience reduced children's risk factors

**1,009** People received supportive legal advocacy services

**157** Adults and children found refuge in the safe house for a total of **6,262** days

**53** Adults and children spent a total of **10,744** days living in one of the **11** transitional apartments

**78** Survivors increased stability and self-sufficiency through vocational services

**585** Victims were assisted at the police station by a crisis response volunteer

**402** adults and **42** children received services at the Morris Family Justice Center

**6,500** Hours of group counseling was provided to **317** people to prevent their use of control and force in relationships

**10,131** adults increased their awareness through one of many community events

**1,313** professionals and volunteers received specialized training on domestic violence

**8,477** teens learned the warning signs of dating abuse and resources for help during one of **344** presentations, including a youth leadership conference
